SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

9<sup>th</sup> December 2018

Already it is the second Sunday of Advent and our School nativity plays will soon be in full swing. It is always a delight to sit and watch the children perform their unique version of the Christmas story.

One person who is always absent however and who plays a major role in Advent is St. John the Baptist. In today's Gospel we welcome his arrival. John was the last of the Old Testament prophets and his mission was preparing the way for Jesus. He passionately calls the people to wake up to the imminent arrival of Christ the anointed Messiah. John fulfils the promise of God through all the prophets including the great prophet Isaiah;

'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: prepare a way for the Lord.'

John may not feature in nativity plays but we must not ignore him. Advent invites us to reflect both on the first coming of Jesus and to prepare for his return by assessing our lives and repenting of our sins. John was a voice, crying in the wilderness and although many ignored him, others humbly submitted, and presented themselves for healing and forgiveness. Today, as then, our world is aching for healing and forgiveness but sadly many people remain deaf and ignorant to this call to freedom.

As Catholics we recognise that reconciliation/confession is Christ's gift to the Church for healing and forgiveness. It is a beautiful Sacrament though sadly very often ignored. Perhaps if you have not been for a while now would be a great time to accept Christ's invitation and receive the beauty and peace of his healing grace.

## Advent prayer (Chris Tiegreen; The Wonder of Advent)

Lord, may Jesus be more real to me this season than he has ever been.

Open my eyes wider than ever to the beauty of his coming.

Give me ears to hear the whisper of your voice.

May your restoration continue and your Kingdom come in my life, in my family, in my place of work, in my church, in my community, in my world, just as in heaven. May I live with excited anticipation throughout this season and beyond. Grant that I would enter into the story and the blessing of the Christ child more fully each year, Amen.

## If any among you are sick, let them send for the priest...

The priests in our pastoral area are committed to the care of our sick and dying parishioners and will always respond as best we can to emergencies. The number for finding a local priest in an emergency is 07891 705145 and is given on all our parish answer machines. These days there are fewer of us and we are sometimes away for a variety of reasons, so we encourage you to ask for the Sacrament of the Sick in good time, before being admitted to hospital or when you or your relatives are seriously ill, so that we can arrange a time to visit and offer this sacrament of healing, encouragement and consolation. If you or relatives are admitted to hospital, please ask the nursing staff to contact the Catholic Chaplaincy team and request a visit. Especially we ask you, whether at home or in hospital, not to wait until your loved one is so close to death that they cannot appreciate the grace they are receiving. People sometimes worry that their loved one will be frightened by this rite but our experience is that the sacrament provides a help and support in times of illness and especially for those approaching death.
